



В Н	B How is GDP Calculated? There is a four-part formula: C + I + G + NX = GDP						
	Personal Consumption Expenditures	Also called <i>consumer spending</i> : the goods and services people buy, such as groceries, clothing, cellphone service, and health care.					
	+ Investment	This is <b>business spending</b> on fixed assets such as land, buildings and equipment, plus investment in unsold inventory; also includes purchases of homes by consumers.					
	+ Government Spending	<b>Spending by federal, state, and local governments</b> to provide goods and services, such as schools, roads, or national defense.					
	+ Net <b>EX</b> ports	Also known as <b>exports minus imports (X - M)</b> : the value of exports to other countries minus the value of imports into the United States. Why are imports subtracted? Consumers, businesses, and governments spend some of their money on imports. U.S.					
	= GDP	production would be overstated if the formula didn't remove imports. The total market value of the goods and services produced within the United States in a year.					















