Three “Analysts”. One Stock. Three Different Forecasts: The “How I Do an SSG” Panel.	To start off our conference, step inside a live research challenge where three stock analysts independently evaluate the same company using the Stock Selection Guide (SSG.) Each analyst will examine the company’s historical growth in sales, pre-tax profit, and earnings per share, while evaluating management quality through key financial measures such as profit margins, return on equity, and debt levels and develop five-year forecasts. The analysts will reveal not only what forecasts they made, but how they arrived at them. You won’t just learn how to fill out an SSG – you’ll learn how these stock analysts think.

Curating Small Stocks for a Quality Growth Portfolio	Find small company prospects for your portfolio by “sweating” for them, “buying” them or “stealing” them. Once prospects are located, narrow the field with some analysis of the companies and your diversification needs. With the field narrowed, monitor your prospects until the time is right to add to your portfolio. Once in your portfolio, keep monitoring the small company components of your portfolio to determine if they are meeting expectations and still fit your diversification needs.

Make the Most of Business Cycles In Investing	There are good reasons to consider minimizing the price you pay when purchasing a stock, and maximizing the price you get when selling a stock, and why 5 years is merely a time horizon – not a minimum hold time. There are times why we might hold a stock longer, or improve our return by selling when the market price is attractive. We will examine buy/sell strategies, business cycles, the universe of P/E ratios and why they matter – all with the goal of turbocharging our investment return. We show you the incremental steps that you and your club can take to improve your portfolio return.
